Reporting Absences

If your child cannot attend school, please let us know as soon as possible. You can:

- Call the School Office on 0161 343 8485 and leave a message explaining the reason for the absence.
- Email us at absence@rosehill.epworthtrust.org.uk with the details.

If we haven't heard from you by 9:30am, our Attendance Officer will try to contact you by phone. If we still can't reach you, a home visit may be carried out.



Each half term, children who achieve 100% attendance, or those who are improving and working towards their goal, will receive a bronze, silver, or gold badge to celebrate their effort. Children who maintain 100% attendance will also receive a special reward as recognition for their commitment.

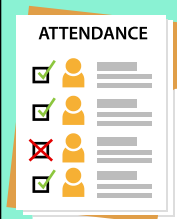
Attendance Matters Did you know...

No school days missed	100%	Fantastic future
2 days absent	99%	10 learning hours lost
4 days absent	98%	20 learning hours lost
6 days absent	97%	30 learning hours lost
7.5 days absent	96%	37.5 learning hours lost
9.5 days absent	95%	47.5 learning hours lost
11 days absent	94%	55 learning hours lost
13 days absent	93%	65 learning hours lost
15 days / 3 weeks absent	92%	75 learning hours lost
17 days absent	91%	85 learning hours lost
19 days absent	90%	95 learning hours lost

Attendance Matters Did you know...

When a student misses 2 days a month:

- They will miss 20 days a year
- They will miss 30 hours of math over the school year
- They will miss 60 hours of reading and writing over the school year





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Arriving on Time

What YOU can do to help make your child successful all day, every day!

- Emphasise the importance of school as it encourages development in all areas.
- Help your child get organised the night before - prepare school uniform, school equipment, PE kit and ensure any school work is ready and complete.
- Set an alarm to help your child wake up a little early so that you can make your way to school in good time.



Holidays During Term Time

Please note that schools will continue to work with parents to reduce unauthorised absences and will consider each term time leave request on a case-by-case basis.

Any holidays or leave taken may be recorded as an unauthorised absence and a Penalty Notice may be issued. You must complete a Term Time Leave Form from the office before you leave so that we are aware of where your child is and when they are due to return.

Failure to inform the school of your child's absence may result in a referral to Tameside Education Welfare as a Child Missing in Education and your child could lose their school place.

Penalty Notices

Penalty Notices can be issued for a range of attendance related offences including unauthorised term-time leave, low attendance or persistent unauthorised absence and late ness after the register closes. Penalty Fines There is a set fine of £160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days, reduced to £80 per parent per child if paid within 21 days. It is important to keep up to date with these procedures. Thank you

Should I keep my child off school?

Yes

	Until...
Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19.
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scabies	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics

No

but make sure you let their school or nursery know about...

Hand, foot and mouth	Glandular fever
Head lice	Tonsillitis
Threadworms	Slapped cheek
